GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show is known as Borrowby Agricultural & Horticultural Society's Combined Show and Gymkhana and includes a Children's Section.
2. The object of the Society is to advance Horticulture and Agriculture for the benefit of the public and for this purpose to hold an Annual Show.
3. The general management is in the hands of the President, Chairman, Secretary and a Committee, none of whom shall be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury of any kind which may be done to or by any entry or for any loss sustained by or any damage suffered by any entrant, competitor, spectator or any member of the public in any manner whatsoever.
4. The Committee may make such Rules and Regulations as they think necessary at any time and may amend any of the same whenever appropriate without notice and have power to refuse any entry without giving any reason or withhold any prize if there appears insufficient merit in the exhibit or any wrong entry.
5. Any dispute or complaint arising from any cause whatsoever must be made to the Secretary in writing as soon as practicable and in any event before the close of the Show or Gymkhana (as the case may be) together with a deposit of £20.00 which may be retained by the Committee should the objection not be upheld and the Committee reserves the right to deal with these and any other matters in such manner as they consider proper. All decisions of the Committee shall be binding on all concerned and without any right of appeal.
6. The decision of the judges is final and they have the power to disqualify any entrant or exhibit if they consider it over the age or weight for the class or otherwise not qualified.
7. Any person who has been disqualified from showing must apply in writing to the Committee for removal of disqualification if he/she wishes to compete in the show.
8. The Show is affiliated to the Association of Show and Agricultural Organisations and a member of The Yorkshire Federation of Show Societies.
9. Public entrance fees £8 per person (over 12yrs), £5 per person (under 12yrs), under 3yrs free of charge. Parking in show field carpark: free. Ringside parking (limited): £5
10. Data retention policy: Borrowby Show will only store and use your information to contact you regarding Borrowby Show; to process your entry, including publishing your entry in the catalogue, results publications and to provide you with details of the following years event. If you do not wish to have your data stored for these purposes please contact us via email at info@borrowbyshow.co.uk or telephone 07495 650282.

AGRICULTURAL AND EQUINE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Judging to commence as per schedule. Each animal must wear the number by which it is distinguished in the Catalogue if applicable and its attendant must remain in charge of it and not leave the Show Field or permit the animal (excluding horses and ponies) to leave until 4.30pm subject to special permission from the Committee and to a penalty of £20.00 for any infringement.
2. All animals entered to be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor.
3. All animals ridden anywhere on the showground, rings or lorry parks must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, with a body score of 2.5-3 out of 5, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.
4. No Pony under four years old to be entered in the Riding Classes.
5. Grain and Roots to have been grown by the exhibitor and to be exhibited outside the tent by 10.30am and to remain until 4.30pm. Judging to commence at 11am. **NO VEHICLES TO REMAIN OUTSIDE SHOW TENT AFTER 10.00AM.**
6. All entries with entry fee to be received by the Secretary not later than midday on 13th July 2026. NO entries accepted after closing date, or substitutions of entries on show day.
7. For horse and sheep classes only, two people will be admitted on to the field free of charge per competitor.
8. Prize money will be paid out on the day of the Show subject to the determination of any dispute or complaint
9. Prize money not claimed by 31st August 2026 will be forfeit and placed in the funds of the Society.

TENT EXHIBIT RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All Produce, Flowers and Vegetables must be the growth of the Exhibitor's own garden (with the exception of classes 181-185) and all other tent entries must be the Exhibitor's own work.
2. **Classes 181-185 Traditional floral foam may not be used unless otherwise stated** as a staging material due to concerns about its non-biodegradability and disposal. Please use eco-friendly, bio-degradable, foam-free flower arranging blocks or other alternatives such as wire, moss, sand etc. Search 'eco friendly flower arranging' online for ideas!
3. The garden of an exhibitor shall be open for inspection by any of the Committee or any person appointed by them.
4. The gates of the Show Ground will be open to receive Tent Exhibits for competition up to 10.00am. **NO VEHICLES TO REMAIN OUTSIDE SHOW TENT AFTER 10.00AM. Exhibits to be staged by 10.30am** at which time the Tent will be cleared of all persons except the stewards. Judging to commence by 11.00am.

5. Exhibits to remain in Tent until 4.30pm.
6. The Secretary will deliver on application numbered tickets to be affixed to the articles intended for competition. All entry fees to be made on entry.
7. All entries with entry fee to be received by the Secretary not later than midday on 13th July 2026. Any individual tent exhibitor spending more than £10 on tent entries will receive a ticket for admission to the Show.
8. The Committee will take every care of the articles exhibited but will not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage.
9. Prize Money will be paid out on the day of the Show at the Main Tent subject to the determination of any dispute or complaint.
10. Prize money not claimed by 31st August 2026 will be forfeit and placed in the funds of the Society.

RULES FOR HANDICRAFT, ART AND PHOTOGRAPHY CLASSES 160 - 180

1. Entries must not have previously been exhibited at Borrowby Show.
2. By submitting your photograph, you represent and warrant that it is your own original work, is not copied, and does not contain any third-party materials and/or content that you do not have permission to use.
3. We cannot consider photographs submitted on behalf of another person.
4. We may arrange your photograph(s) as we think fit to appear and we may remove your photograph(s) at any time.
5. Photographs not to exceed A5.
6. Paintings and drawings to be suitably trimmed and mounted to enable them to be hung to the boards.

CAVY AND RABBIT SECTION RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All entries with entry fee to be received by the Secretary of the Fur Section not later than 6pm on 21st July 2026. Any individual exhibitor in the Cavy and Rabbit Section spending more than £10 on entries in the Cavy and Rabbit Section will receive a ticket for admission to the Show.
2. All exhibits to be in the show tent by 10am and will remain until 4.30pm. All exhibits to be the real property of the exhibitor. No exhibitor will be able to take their exhibit from the pens during show hours without a steward present.
3. Proper pens will be provided. The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage sustained by exhibitors during show hours.
4. Please bring your own water bottles; shavings will be available from a steward.
5. Please state on entry if a large pen is required so they may be pre-booked.
6. Juveniles are to be aged from 3 years up to 16 years old, please specify age on entry form.
7. Any animals showing signs of illness will be removed from the tent.

Top Tips for First Time Entrants in the Show Tent

Always thought about entering a class in the Show Tent at Borrowby Show but never quite dared? Here are some guidelines that will hopefully help persuade you to have a go...

As a rule, when a class requests several items the same, they should all be as uniform in size, colour and shape as possible – this applies to the baking classes, the egg classes, the flower classes and the fruit and vegetable classes.

Any fruit or vegetable that is dirty, damaged, misshapen (Class 221 excluded!), over or under ripe will be marked down. Be careful not to over polish though as a natural bloom on the fruit and veg is desirable. Flowers and foliage should be disease and insect damage free. Good staging and presentation is important – choose a vase to suit the height of your flower stems.

Cakes etc should be exhibited on a plate or doily proportionate to the size of the entry and preferably covered with cling film. Bread can be exhibited on a board and should **not** be made on the day of the Show.

Preserves should be in clean, clear jars. Recycled jars and lids should have NO commercial trademarks on at all. Jars should be well filled and clearly labelled, stating main fruit and day/month/year of making. Chutneys should be at least 2 months old.

Handicrafts – well presented, clean, tidy work is best. Ironed if necessary. Pin your exhibitor card to any soft items to avoid confusion when being examined by the judge.

Ensure you have understood the schedule and keep to the numbers and sizes etc specified in each class. Any entry that is 'not according to schedule' could be disqualified!

Still unsure about a particular class, please do ask – the Secretary can be contacted at info@borrowbyshow.co.uk Looking at photos of previous entries on the Show website can be helpful, as can asking friends and neighbours who may have entered in the past. We are a small, friendly, village show and taking part is a great way to support and enjoy the day.

What to do once you have decided to enter...

First decide which classes you would like to enter, then enter online at www.borrowbyshow.co.uk. Entries can also be made at Borrowby Village Hall on Sunday 12th July 1pm-4pm.

The Secretary will send you exhibitor cards for each class that you have entered. These will show the class number and your allocated exhibitor's number. Be sure to bring these cards with you on Show Day as they need to be placed beside or on your entry.

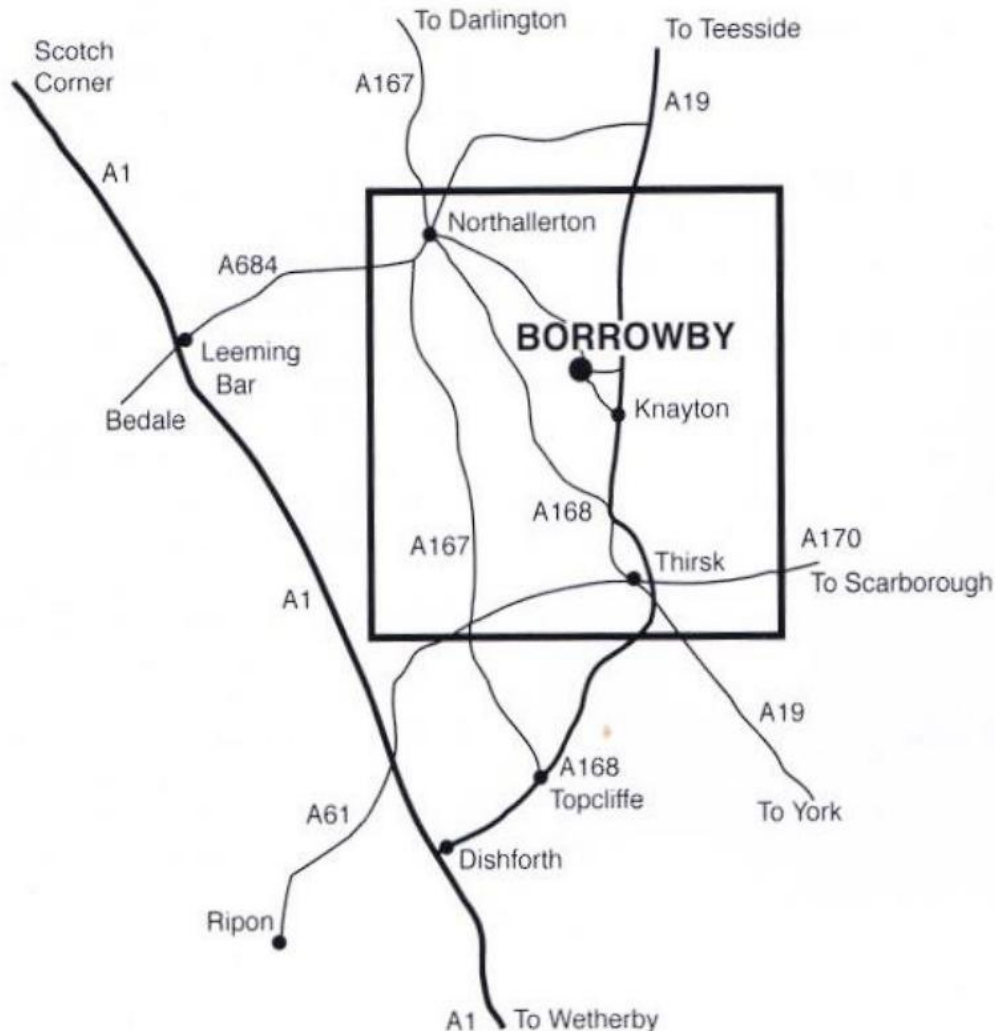
On Show Day bring your exhibits to the Show Tent any time from 8am. The tables in the tent have the class numbers pinned to them. Find your class and position your exhibit and card. Tent stewards are available to help if you are unsure. All exhibits **MUST** be in position by 10.30am. It can be very busy in the tent - be sure to allow yourself enough time to position your entries before heading outside to enjoy the rest of the Show!

Judging commences by 11am and the tent is usually open for viewing by about 1/1.30pm when the decisions of our judges are revealed! You might be a winner! Exhibits remain in the tent until 4.30pm and prize money is paid out in the Show Tent at that time.

Hope you've decided to have a go; it's all good fun and hope to see you at the Show!
